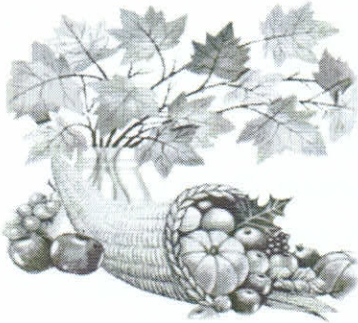

The Blawnox Borough Food Drive provided 16 local families with food to prepare their Thanksgiving meal.

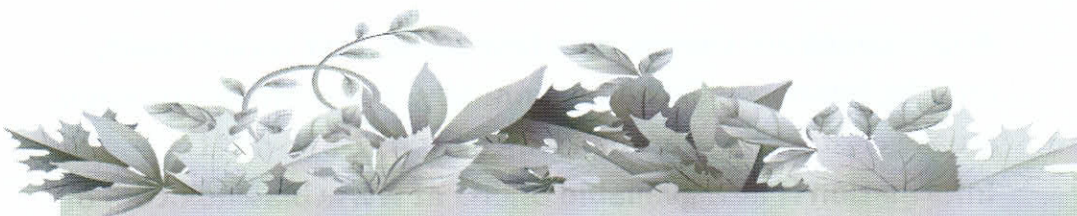
Additionally, the Borough was able to make a sizeable donation to the Fox Chapel Food Drive.

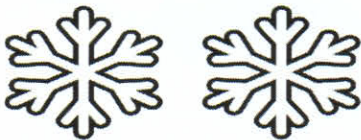




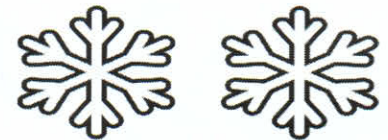
Night of the Lights

BE SALT SMART



Now that winter is in full swing, help protect our streams by being salt smart. Once you apply salt, it doesn’t just go away. It washes into the nearest storm drain and pollutes our creeks and streams. Using salt, the right way, will save money and help the environment.

One pound of salt fits in a 12 oz. coffee mug and is enough to treat 10 sidewalk squares or 20 feet of driveway. When you spread salt, leave space between salt grains, it should not be piled or clumped. It can cause damage to pavement. More salt does not mean more melting. Take time to make sure that salt is spread evenly.
